





July Farm

farmers who produced milk for the New York metropolitan milk marketing area in July will be paid a uniform price of \$4.09 per hundredweight (46.5 quarts), i was announced today by Dr. C. J. Blanford, Market Administra tor. The uniform price in June was \$3.72 per hundredweight. It was \$3.92 in July of 1956.

The producer butterfat differential for the month was announced at six cents for each tenth of a pound of fat above or below the 3.5 percent standard.

The July price is the last one to be announced under the marketing orders which regulated milk only for the metropolitan area which includes New York City and Nassau, Westchester and Suffolk Counties. Effective August 1, the area was expanded to include Northern New-Jersey and a large area of Upstate New York.

While the production of milk in July was 6.2 percent under last year, the consumption of fluid milk in the marketing area was up

3.61 percent. Farm value of the July milk was \$27,923,305.56, the Administrator said. This was \$786,994.31 less than farm value of \$28,710,-299.87 last year.
