





A uniform farm price of \$4.86 per hundredweight will be paid for milk delivered in October, Dr. ', J. Blanford, market administrator of the New York-New Jersey milk marketing area has announced. The farm price was \$4.71 per hundredweight in September; in October, 1957, the farm price was \$5.07 per hund-

The producer butterfat differential for October was wanounced at 5.2 cents for each tenth of a pound of fat above or below the 3.5 percent standard. Dr. Blanford reported that both the production of milk and the consumption of fluid milk rose above the comparable amounts of a year ago. "Total production wasup 3.48 percent over October, 1957, while consumption increased 0.40 percent.

Dr. Blanford said that the total farm value of the October produc--tion-amounted-to-\$38,029,341.20.
