

Southern Tier Farmers Should Grow More Legumes

New York farmers, particularly those in the North Country, Hudson Valley, and the Southern Tier could grow an additional two million acres of high-yielding alfalfa and birdsfoot trefoil in place low-yielding red clover and

Prof. Reeshan Feuer of the State College of Agriculture at Cornell says there are a million acres of soil drained well enough for alfalfa and a mixture of Naragansett alfalfa and Viking trefoil; and 9000,000 acres of soil good emough for birdsfoot trefoil. In the Southern Tier, for example, farmers could easily double their acreage of alfalfa and alenough lime to bring the plow layer up to 6.8 pH and use rechave enough. don't A total of 554 soil tests in Tioga County, for example, showed that 45 per cent of the soils don't have enough lime to grow le-


.But the professor says it will pay farmers to add the lime to foil because the results are "far superior" to what they're getting now with red clover and timothy which are lower yielding and less valuable as feed.
