Regional Game Manager, Howard Bobseine of Olean, credited the 20 per cent increase in take to excellent tracking snow that existed throughout much of the fix, day season and the introduction of Saturday hunting. Previous seasons which lasted three to five day, were limited to weekend only.

According to Albert G. Hall, Chief of the Department's Bureau of Game, this year's "harvest" represents less than ten percent of the region's calculated spring population—a figure well below what is considered a safe huntable manager.
