Commercial Hybrid Wheat may soon be a reality, according to the Department of Agriculture. Producing a hybrid seed necessitates growing plants whose flowers are male, sterile and unable to fertilize themselves. These plants get pollen from a normal plant to produce seed. The resulting plant is crossed with another that will restore male fertility to produce kernels. Result: a greatly increased per-acre yield and reduced production costs.

Captain Irving Johnson, United States Naval Reserve officer will present a film lecture at Houghton College, January 11 at 8:00 p. m. Entitled "The Yankee Sails Across Europe", the lecture will tell of Captain Johnson's cruise through Europe's inland waterways in his new ketch, "Yankee". Focusing attention on little-known areas of Europe, Captain Johnson's color films will create new impressions of Holland, Belgium, France, Italy Switzerland and the Greek Islands.

The Varsity 7 of Alfred University has been selected as one of 29 collegiate groups in the nation to make overseas tours during the current academic year to entertain American armed forces under sponsorship of the USO.
