The final meeting of the Greenwood Town Board was held December 28, 1962 at the office of the Clerk. The books of Supervisor Howard Brewster, two Justices, Stanley Murray and Douglas Cornell and Town Clerk, Marjorie York, were audited and found to be correct. Town Clerk Marjorie York received a total of \$1956.75. She remitted \$236.25 in fees to Supervisor Brewster; \$1264.00 to the Conservation Department; \$464.00 to the County Treasurer for dog licenses and \$2.50 to the Health Department for one marriage license. The Clerk's report showed that there were 60 Chatter Mortgages; 15 Assignments; 36 Releases; 39 Conditional Sales; 3 Assignments Filled and 5 Explosive Licenses issued. There were 23 Residential Hunting and Fishing; 99 Hunting; 4 Trapping; 14 non-Resident Hunting; 15 non-Resident Big Game; 2 non-Resident Fishing and 151 Resident Big Game Licenses issued. There were 10 Burial Permits filed in 1962.

J. Glenn Freeland 62 of Canisteo died Wednesday. He was born in Greenwood the son of Denzel and Lettie Freeland. He built the first radio in town and ran a Saturday night movie at the Masonic Hall. The family had lived in Canisteo 33 years where he operated a theater for 28 years. He was survived by his wife, Lulu Prentice Freeland, a son, Francis Gerald Freeland of Canisteo; a daughter, Mrs. Robert Johnson (Eleanor) of Whitehall and three grandsons. A memorial service was held at the Crandall and Crandall Funeral Home in Canisteo Thursday night by Sentinel Lodge No. 151 F. & A. M. of Greenwood. The funeral service was held there Friday afternoon with Rev. Sanford of the Canisteo Baptist Church officiating assisted by Rev. Parmelee of the Woodhull Baptist Church. Burial was in the Hornell Rural Cemetery.
