Midmorning estimates indicated losses included 29 cattle, 100 sheep, four pigs, a brooder-eollie-dog, 100 tons of hay and six tons of feed. Saved from the flames were 11 head of cattle a trailer and milking equipment. The cattle saved were led to safety through holes cut in the side of the burning barn.

Mrs. Katie Dennis, 45, of R. D. 4, Binghamton, sustained lacerations of the forehead and contusions of the chest and knees. Katherine Green, passenger, also of R. D. 4, Binghamton suffered a laceration of the mouth and abrasions of the left hand. Both were treated at the Jones Memorial Hospital and released. The 4:15 p. m. mishap, occurred on Route 17 on the curve at the approach to the Erie-Lackawanna Railroad overhead bridge, 1 1/2 miles west of the Town of Andover, where a Wells-ville woman last her life last week.
