Dr. George A. Gardner To Be Guest Speaker At County Red Cross Meeting

Guest speaker at the Allegany County Red Cross annual meeting on February 4, 1963 will be Dr. George A. Gardner, professor of sociology at Alfred University.

A graduate of Princeton University where he majored in political science, Dr. Gardner later studied theology in Edinburg, Scotland. In 1936, he and his wife went to Greece with the American Farm School. He worked there until 1941.

With the advent of World War II, he and his family fled before the German army to America via Cape Town, South Africa. During the remainder of the war, he worked with the Greek relief program through the American Red Cross and the North East Foundation. In 1944 he joined the United Nations and worked with UNRA.

After the German retreat from Greece, Dr. Gardner returned to that country with the Greek mission and remained there during the Greek civil war, during which he directed the UNRA program. Following his service with UNRA, he joined the U. S. Relief Program in Greece. In 1948, he spent six months in

Trieste. That summer, when all the relief programs were completed, he returned to America for graduate study. The following year, he traveled to Cairo, Egypt where he was associated with the American University. In 1962 he joined the faculty of Alfred University.

Dr. Gardner has made a profession of living in another part of the world. He has worked to build people who can live cross-culturally. To live a lesson, and not to preach it, has been his goal.

Richard C. Ludden, 36, of Red Creek died Tuesday, January 29, 1963.


