Notice Of Public Hearing On Fire Protection Contract

A public hearing will be held at the Village Office on Main Street, Andover, New York, on Tuesday, February 19th, 1963, on the proposed fire protection contract between the Town of Andover and the Village of Andover as parties of the first part, and the Andover Fire Department Inc., party of the second part. Under said proposed contract, the Town of Andover and the Village of Andover are each to pay the Andover Fire Department Inc., the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00), a year for a term of five (5) years, being a total sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00), a year. Under the terms of the said contract, the said \$15,000.00 to be paid by the Town of Andover is to be paid directly to the Village of Andover, who in turn will then pay the \$3,000.00 directly to the Andover Fire Department Inc. Said Contract to be for a five (5) year term, from June 1st, 1962 to May 31st, 1967.

The Andover Fire Department Inc., on its part agrees to supply fire protection, both to the Village of Andover and the Town of Andover, and supply it own fire equipment, and to maintain a volunteer fire department, with sufficient members to supply fire protection to the Village and Town of Andover.

All interested parties are hereby invited to attend the said hearing.

New Estimates Of Farm Milk Prices

New York, Jan. 29.—New estimates of farm prices for milk produced in the New York-New Jersey milkshed in the first half of 1963 were issued here today by Anson J. Pollard, assistant market administrator. Dr. Pollard said it now appears that prices will average about 13 cents per hundredweight below those for the same 1962 period. He said his office earlier had estimated that prices would average 20 cents per hundredweight under a year ago.
