—Mrs. Mary McAndrew spent Saturday guest of Mr. and Mrs. William Wahl and helped to celebrate Marie Wahl's birthday.

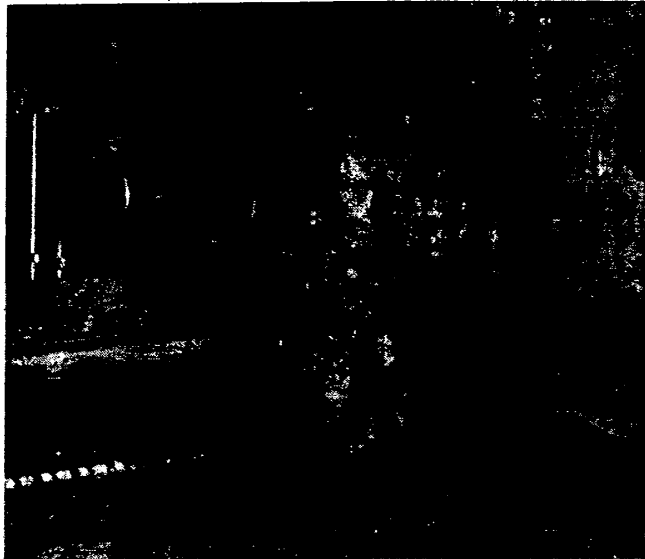

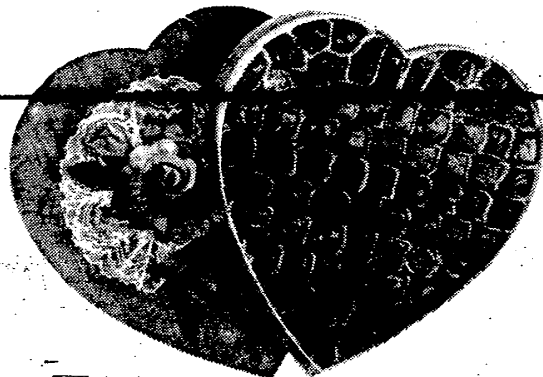


"Jeff" Common congratulating "Danny" Smith after their 1, 2 win in the 400 yard Freestyle race. Photo by Wittie

Following the meeting refreshments were served and a Valen-

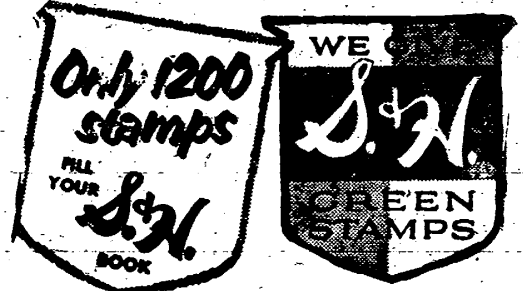
tine entertainment was enjoyed by the group.
