Applications for the Selective Service College Qualification Test to be given on Thursday, April 18 are row available to college students at Local Board 71, 48 Schuyler Street, Belmont, N. Y., Claire Backus, Chairman, has announced. If it is inconvenient for a registrant to call at this office he may obtain his application or information concerning, the test from any Selective Service local board. Applications for the test must be postmarked no later than midnight, Thursday March 28th. The test will be given at the Applications for the Selective

Students registered with Selective Service in the State of New York who are attending college outside of the State should contact the proper authorities at the col-lege for information on applications for the test and testing sites

provide local boards with evidence of aptitude for continued underof aptitude for continued under-graduate and graduate study. The scores will not of themselves de-termine eligibility for deferment, but are considered with other in-formation by the boards in deter-mining whether to defer individ-ual registrants for further study. The test, used since 1951 to aid

ne test, used since 1991 to alc local boards in determining ques-tions of student determent, is ad-ministered for the 1962-63 school year by Science Research Asoci-ations, McHenry, Illinois.

To be eligible to take the test, the applicant must be satisfactor-ily pursuing a full-time college undergraduate or graduate level, leading to a degree. He need not be a student of a 4-year need not be a student of a 4-year college, but his entire course of study must be satisfactory for transfer of credits to a degree-granting institution.

The applicant must be a Selective Service registrant who intends to seek deferment as a student. He can take the test only once

"At the present time, New York local boards reach men for siduction at about age 23", Chairman Backus said. "Students generally can be nearly through their undergraduate studies at that age. But those planning to continue studies in graduate school, for example, will need a deferment to do so. Heavier draft calls would lower the age at which local boards reach men for induction,

boards reach men for induction, and deferments might be necessary to finish undergaduate work.

In either case a test score in the file will give the local board an additional piece of important information to use in determining whether a registrant is eligible for a student deferment.
