John T. D'Arcy Named Chairman Of Heart Fund

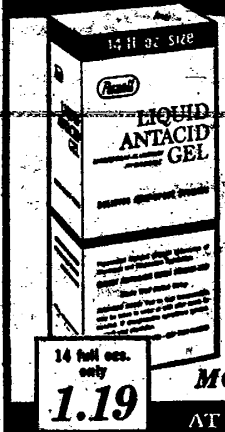
