Allegany County received \$55,297.44 as per capita assistance from the state for the fourth quarter of the 1962-63 fiscal year.

January Milk Brings \$4.24

A uniform farm price of \$4.24 per hundredweight will be paid for January deliveries to pool handlers in the New York-New Jersey milk marketing area, Dr. C. J. Blanford, market administrator has announced. The December price was \$4.36 per hundredweight; dairymen received \$4.34 in January, 1962.

The producer butterfat differential was computed at the rate of 5.6 cents for each tenth of a pound of fat above or below the 8.5 percent standard.

The administrator reported that receipts from producers rose by 72,293,374 pounds from January, 1962, and that total consumption of fluid milk was up by 16,064,099 pounds. Receipts totaled 993,473,576 pounds, an increase of 7.85 percent. Consumption climbed 3.41 percent to 486,895,784 pounds.

The farm value of January deliveries was \$43,585,806.75, not including the various differentials paid to dairy farmers.
