Heart Fund Nets \$320.00

For the Year 1961-62 Your Heart Fund Dollars made possible the following program in Allegany County.

RESEARCH: 35% of the funds raised in the county are channeled through the New York State Heart Assembly and the American-Heart Association for research. In addition to this your County Heart Chapter made a grant of \$100 to the Heart Research Fund of the New York State Heart Assembly, Inc.

EDUCATION: The Heart Chapter does not provide any direct financial or medical aid, but it maintains an information and referral service to which Heart patients and their families may turn, not only to learn what the local program provides, but also to receive concrete assistance in finding and using other appropriate health resources in their own communities. This service was given to 5 individuals during the year. Over 7500 pamphlets, posters and flyers were distributed to schools, industrial plants and the general public. Films made available to groups requesting them, talks before clubs and organizations. The latest information relating to many advances made in diagnosis and treatment of cardiovascular diseases are continuously being brought to the attention of Allegany County physicians as well as auxiliary groups through programs of education, information and

demonstration. COMMUNITY SERVICE: Heart Fund Dollars help establish community Heart Programs designed to rehabilitate cardiacs; to prevent rheumatic fever and in other ways to help patients take advantage of our present knowledge.

Since 1956 the County Heart Chapter has actively worked to combat recurrent attacks of Rheumatic Fever. The number of persons receiving this service has continued to increase. At the present 56 persons are receiving free penicillin tablets which are dispensed through family physician. Adult as well as child cardiacs have the benefit of diagnostic services at our Cardiac Clinic held in Wellsville under the direction of a Cardiologist. 27 were served at the clinic the past year.

Andover can be proud to be a part of this program. To date the collections total \$320.00. Special thanks go to the Senior Class for their contribution of \$25.00 and to the Junior Class for \$25.00 they gave. The donations were in memory of Lois Reil.

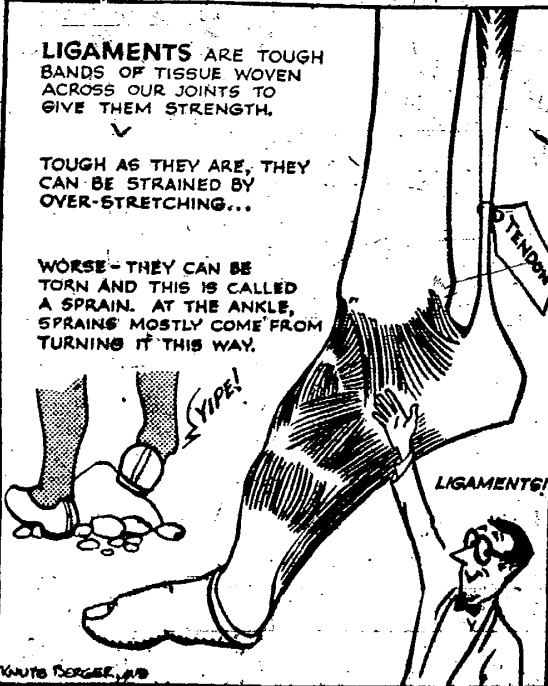
