Mr. Chamberlain, chairman of the Allegany County Soil Conservation District says: "We have on our twenty-one year old roads to the county constructed 1,099,840 feet of ditches, 226,525 feet of open drains; 25,877 feet of tile drains; 3,700 feet of waterways and 11,850 feet of stream channel improvement. Now, with spring thaws and large amounts of water being

tough down our hillsides, is the time to inspect these structures.

A farm drainage system is not a thing that you can construct and forget. It must be inspected and necessary maintenance measures taken or it will eventually fail to do the job for which it was planned.

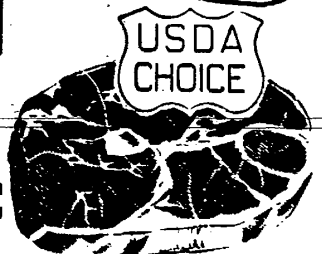
