#### Muskrat And Beaver Trapping Extended

Conservation Commissioner Harold G. Wilm today extended to April 6th the trapping season for muskrat in most sections of the Southern Zone and granted a two week extension to beaver trapping operations in the southeast portion of the state.

The regular season for both species ends March 23.

In announcing the season extensions, Commissioner Wilm said prolonged freezing and excessive snow during the bulk of the regular season had hampered trapping operations and prevented an adequate harvest of the muskrat and beaver populations.

Cub Scouts Will Sell First-Aid Kits in "Be Prepared For Accidents" Campaign

Starting March 25, 1963 and running through April 6, 1963, the Andover Pack No. 77 of the Cub Scouts BSA will conduct a house-to-house "Be Prepared For Accidents" campaign in Andover.

Members of the group will visit every home in the community. They will present the homeowner with a first-aid chart showing approved procedures for dealing with various types of accidents, and will offer to assist the homeowner in checking his first-aid supplies to determine whether his home is adequately stocked for accident emergencies.

Where inadequacies are revealed, the members of the group will be able to offer a selection of first-aid kits so that the homeowner may choose the kit that best meets his needs. Kits designed for use inside or outside the home will be available. Auto kits, travel kits and kits suitable for the hunter and fisherman will be included in the selection.

The first-aid kits are supplied by Johnson & Johnson, the world's largest manufacturer of surgical dressings. Profits realized on the sale of the kits will be used to meet the costs of a variety of activities and projects which the Cub Scouts perform.




