Dr. Julian Bandy To Conduct Crusade
 Dr. Julian Bandy of Toccoa Falls Georgia, will conduct a Bible Evangelistic Crusade, March 24 thru 31, 7:30 p. m. nightly in the new Christian & Missionary Alliance Church, on Highland Ave., in Wellsville. He will speak at all Sunday services and week-night services. A varied program of special music will be presented each night. Dr. Bandy will speak at the area Youth for Christ Rally on Saturday night.

Dr. Bandy is a preacher and Bible teacher of rare ability. He has preached from coast to coast and on the mission fields of South America and Africa. He has commanded with grace and acceptance some of the large pulpits in our Country. During his ministry in Asheville, N. C., he was the pastor of the Nationally-known evangelist, Billy Graham.

Such large Bible Conferences as Winona Lake Conference in Indiana, Word of Life Camp at Schoon Lake, N. Y., have engaged Dr. Bandy as a speaker in their large summer sessions. When Dr. R. A. Forrest retired as President of Toccoa Falls Bible College in 1957, Dr. Bandy was unanimously elected as his successor. This is the oldest Bible College in the Southern states. Among other administrative duties, he is a member of the Board of Managers of the Christian and Missionary Alliance, which is the sixth largest Missionary Society in the field of Christian missions.

Another treat will be the ministry of Dr. Harold Boon, President of Nyack Missionary College on the Hudson, on Palm Sunday morning and evening. John Brown University Choir will sing at the morning services, 10:30 a. m. on April 7th.

Meat Graders Exam To Be Held
 The United-States Civil Service Commission has announced a new examination for Agricultural Commodity Grader (Meat) for duty with the Agricultural Marketing Service of the Department of Agriculture. These positions pay \$5540 and \$6675 a year. Meat graders work in packing houses, slaughter houses, cold storage warehouses, and the like in many states. Applicants must have had appropriate experience for part of which college training may be substituted. They must also pass a written test and a meat grading performance test. Full information may be found in Announcement 300 B.

Applications will be accepted until further notice by the Central Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington 25, D. C. Civil Service announcements and application forms may be obtained from many post offices throughout the country, from your nearest Civil Service Commission Regional Office, or from the U. S.
