Rules For Exhibitors

1. Entries accepted on Friday, April 19, from 2:00 to 9:00 p.m.

2. There may be only one entry for each variety in a class, but more than one variety may be entered in each color class.

3. All entries in competitive classes must have been in possession of exhibitor for at least three months prior to date of SHOW.

4. Violets in decorative classes need not be owned by exhibitors.

5. All entries must be clean and disease free.

6. Each pot must be plainly labeled with owner's name and then neatly wrapped in aluminum foil. Use of foil is imperative. Avoid flaring of foil above edge of pot.

7. Each entry must be given its proper name. This is subject to correction by the Classification Committee.

8. The Club will offer all possible protection to entries, but is not responsible for any loss or damage thereto. Plants may NOT be removed until close of show.

9. All entries must be single crown, except in multiple crown class.

10. All Special Awards must be Blue Ribbon Winners.

11. Decisions of the Judges will be final.

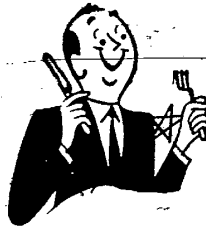
