**Local Students Will Participate In Science Congress At Alfred Tech**

Michael Miglis and William Merrick from Andover Central School are among the 300 entries that have been received from Allegany and Steuben Counties for the third annual Regional Science Congress to be held at Alfred Tech, Saturday, April 6th.

The Allegany Science Teachers Association, an organization that includes science teachers of Steuben County Schools, will sponsor the Regional Congress with the students setting up their exhibits and displays in the Industrial Science Building on the College's East Side beginning at 8:30 p. m.

Junior division competition will be held for students in grades 7-9, both in the exhibit and lecture-demonstration categories. Senior division areas of competition are in chemistry, physics, biology or earth science and may be entered as exhibits or as lecture-demonstrations, a type of display which requires a verbal explanation by the entering student. Ten-minute lecture-demonstrations, by the rules of the Congress, are limited to students who have done research on a problem.

Winners of the first three lecture demonstrations from grades 11 & 12 will be designated to represent the two-county area at the State Science Congress in Albany May 17 and 18, 1963. All entrants will receive a certificate and first place winners of the exhibits and lecture-demonstrations will receive small cash awards.

The awards will be made at a 3 p. m. ceremony at the Ag-Tech gym.
