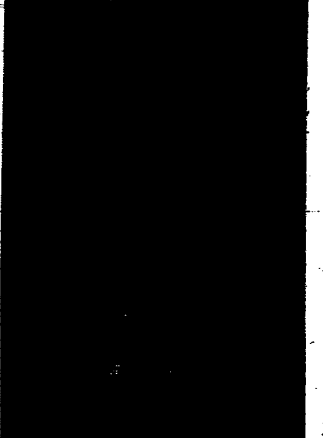
## HALL OF FAME
