Lower Freight Rates Extended As Farm Aid

Commissioner of Agriculture Don J. Wickham announced that O. E. Schultz, Secretary of the Eastern Railroads Traffic Association has notified him that the Eastern Railroad Association has arranged to extend reduced rates of 25 percent on hay, within the eastern territory. The Association is also accepting rates from origins on the C&NW, CMSTP&P, Green Bay and Western and Soo Lines. Provisions for permitting substitution of two 40 ft. cars in lieu of one 50 ft. car with a minimum of 56,000 pounds were extended to April 30. This action taken by the railroads will helpmake it possible for the dairy farmers in the drought-hit New York counties to continue to get western hay through April, or until grass is available, the Commissioner said.
