State Legion Commander, Auxiliary **President Welcomed To Andover**

Dr. F. Herrick Conners, American Legion Commander of the Department of New York, from Cohoes, N. Y., Mrs. Robert L. Johnson, President of the New York State American Legion Auxiliary, from Nanuet; and their respective staffs were extended a cordial greeting by local Village and School Officials as well as Allegany County Legionnaires, their wives and other friends at a testimonial banquet held at the Andover Central School.

Over 125 Legionnaires, Auxil-

Over 125 Legionnaires, Auxiliary members and guests attended the banquet held in the school cafeteria, following a social period at the local American Legion

and James H. Kessler supervising principal of the school gave brief welcoming speeches following the dinner to start the program conducted by Craig Snyder, Allegany County American Legion Commander. Craig, with the assistance of Mrs. Jesse R. Pounds, President of the Allegany County American Legion Auxiliary welcomed visiting County Commanders and Auxiliary Presidents and then introduced the visiting dignitaries.

Commander Conners, in his ad-dress, sounded warnings of fail-ure in two areas when he stated that lack of action on the Korean Bonus in face of "a moral obliga-tion to citizens of this state"; caused this measure to be drop-ped; while failure of the U. S. to keep pace with Russia in technical training of its youth is causing a 10-to-1 lag on the part of this country.

Dr. Conners described as "quite significant" the Legion's effect on the New York State Legislature, and said the Korean bonus effort drew no effective help from the Legislature or the Governor. He expressed belief the failure result-

Legislature or the Governor. He expressed belief the failure resulted from "spotty activity" for the cause. "We need a 100 per cent undertaking by all 'individuals and groups who know that we'of New York State have a moral obligation to the Korea veterans," the state commander stated.

Contrasting educational opportunities available to youths in America and Russia, Dr. Conners noted that Russia gives universal training to its more intelligent individuals. They are provided tuition, room, board and monthly wages to attend schools of higher education, he commented. Individuals with less academic ability are trained in technical schools.

Engineers in the two countries are about equal in number and training, the speaker stated, but the Russia properties.

"We must do something very we must do something very shortly in technical fields or we will lose our scientific standing." Dr. Conners stated. "This is not reassuring!"
