R.D. Carriers Aid In Farm Survey

Rural mail carriers out of the Andover, N. Y., Post Office, and throughout the country generally are distributing to farmers questionnaire cards of the June 1963 Rural Carrier Livestock Survey, Postmaster Mary A. Burns, said today.

A joint Federal-State project, this June survey gathers information on cattle and milk cows, and on numbers of calves, pigs and

lambs born this winter and spring. Information on poultry and wool production is also sought.

Some 22,000 questionnaire cards are being distributed to farmers throughout New York State. The Post Office and rural mail carriers provide the contact with farmers for the survey. Rural carriers leave cards in mail boxes of a cross section of farmers. Completed cards from New York farmers are forwarded by the Post Office to the Federal-State New York Crop Reporting Service at Albany, New York.
