Quarter Horse Show Planned For This Summer

The first approved Quarter Horse Show ever held in the Southern Tier is being planned for this summer under the combined sponsorship of the Kanestio Valley Riding and Driving Club and the Alfred-Almond Double-A 4-H₆Sad-

Alfred-Almond Double-A 4-H₆Saddle Club.

The event will be held July 20 at the East Valley Corral outside Alfred Station and is expected to attract over two hundred of the f.nest Quarter Horses in the northeast. Melvin Westlake of Almond, who has been named as Show Chairman, says entries will come from New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Canada.

Points acquired by horses at the Alfred Station show will count toward year-end championships established by Quarter Horse organizations at both the state and national levels. Granting their approval are the American Quarter Horse Association, with headquarters in Amarillo, Texas, the National Cutting Horse Association, the Empire State Quarter Horse Association and the East Coast Cutting Horse Association.

A full schedule of classes will be offered, consisting of both the breeding or halter classes, which deal with the proper conformation and physical characteristrics typical of the breed, and the performance classes, which show the versatility of the breed and what the Quarter Horse can actually do. A detailed program will be announced at a later date.

Spokesmen for the two sponsoring organizations stated that they feel the growing interest in the

Spokesmen for the two sponsoring organizations stated that they feel the growing interest in the Quarter Horse industry warrants an approved show in this area. There are over two thousand registered Quarter Horses in New York State, and on the national scale Quarter Horse people claim the breed has grown to the point that registered Quarter Horse outnumber all other breeds combined. The American Horse Association says 40,000 Quarter

Sociation says 40,000 Quarter
Horses were registered last year.
Many exhibitors are expected at
