A share of the money goes for research into causes of mental retardation and mental illness.

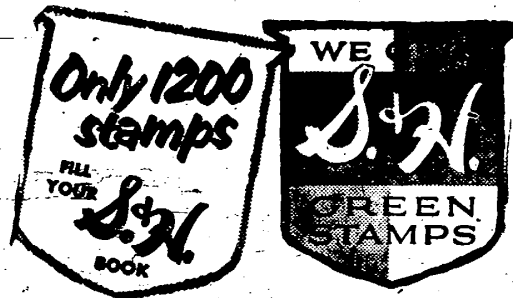
