Local Firm Receives Contract

The Ford & Peckham Co., of Andover was low bidder for the construction of a new maintenance building for the Steuben County Highway Department at Canisteo, County Highway Superintendent Robert A. Reed of Bath has announced.

The Andover firm was the lowest of four bidders for the new prefab steel building with a bid of \$13,664.

Other bidders included Dalrymple Associates of Elmira \$13,675;

Bath Steel Construction \$14,895; Warren Wood Inc., of Vestal, \$15,791.

The new maintenance building is to replace the former structure which was sold to the Village of Canisteo.

The county highway buildings committee, consisting of Chairman Alton Comstock of Hartsville, Earl Wilson of Tuscarora, and Robert Johnson of West Union opened the bids and awarded the contract.
