Subsequent to the war he settled in the Washington area to work on a Doctorate in Electronics at Maryland Gradate School and MIT concurrently working as an Electronic Engineer in the field of radar. He distinguished himself by winning an outstanding government award for original design which saved million of dollars for the Government. In 1956 he was one of a group selected to help close the missile gap with Russia. In this capacity he provided technical direction to many of the nations major missile and space projects including ATLAS, SCOUT, AGENA, MARBM, MISSILE B, and TITANS I, II and III. It is generally accepted that the gap no longer exisits, and more of the nation's efforts are being focused on space. cused on space.


