He is a member of the American Philological Association, The Classical Association of the British Isles, The American Classical League, and The Classical Association of the Atlantic States of which he was secretary-treasurer for six years and is currently a Vice President. In the summer of 1958, he conducted the Houghton College European Tour Group.
