The Summer Playground, swimming, and music program of the Greenwood Recreation Program got under way Monday, July 8, according to an announcement by Stanley Murray, Town Committee-man.

Each morning Monday through Friday two divisions of the program will be in operation on the school playground. Boys and girls ages 4 - 16 are invited to participate in general playground activity consisting of games, hikes, contests, sports, stories, and films. Miss Barbara Lamphier and Mrs. Elaine Holt will be in charge of this division.

The second division consists of two groups of boys who wish to play baseball or softball. Two team will be formed based on age of the boys. One team will be for boys 8 - 12; the other for 13 - 16. In addition to practice, coaching, and local playground games, it is planned that games will be played with similar teams from playgrounds of neighboring communities. James DeMarte is in charge of this division.

Swimming will be Mondays through Fridays using the Hornell pool. Each Monday the pool is reserved for Greenwood participants only from 11:30 a. m. to 1:00 p. m. On these days, in addition to life guards there will also be swimming instruction by personnel of the pool staff. On Monday the bus will leave the school at 11 a. m.

Tuesdays through Fridays, the use of the pool is general. Buses will leave each afternoon at 2:30 p. m. and return to Greenwood about 5:30 p. m.

Also part of the summer activities is a division of music under the direction of Mrs. June Rollins. Individual lessons will be given each week by appointment. Cards have been sent to all known participants to notify of these appointments. Any person wishing to be included who has not received a card should contact Mrs. Rollins.
