Quarter Horse Races To Be New Feature At Allegany County Fair

A brand new feature of the 1963 Allegany County Fair has been added this year according to L. L. Stillwell, Executive Secretary. Six Quarter Horse Races are scheduled for Saturday afternoon, August 10th, as a part of the full day approved Quarter Horse Show to be judged by James Pratt, Sarnia, Ontario, Canada. The show includes halter or conformation classes, performance classes, as well as the racing schedule.

The Quarter Horse had its beginning as a race horse, seldom running more than 440 yards in colonial days, hence, the name "quarter miler".

During recent years the horse once run on village streets and on country lanes has captured the attention of those who follow the Sport of Kings, as Quarter Horse racing has spread rapidly throughout America.

The Allegany County Fair Association has arranged, therefore, this racing program and show as a new thrill feature for the 1963 Fair.

The racing classes are already filled according to Chairman Patricia Hurd, Almond, who reports that horses are coming from throughout New York State as well as outside of the State. Floyd Coker, Stafford, Virginia, has entered two outstanding horses, a 2 year-old and a 3 year old in the races to give the New York State horses a "run for their money".

While this new fair feature is expected to attract a large crowd on Saturday, there will be the usual outstanding 4-H Light Horse Show on Friday, August 9th and Saturday, August 10th, with Horsemanship, Conformation, Performance and Game classes. Entries ranging from colorful ponies to the English gaited classes, as well as the Western Horses, make this now a popular program for Allegany County 4-H Horse "Fans". For the "old timers" there will be some heavy draft hitches and halter classes on Friday, as well as the pulling contest on Thursday evening.

To insure something of interest to everyone, the traditional Harness Races will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday of Fair Week.

This is without question one of the most complete programs of its kind to be held in New York State this year.

Reporters' Immunity

Should there be a Federal law giving immunity to reporters from U. S. court action for refusing to disclose the source of information received in confidence?

Senator Kenneth B. Keating (R. N.Y.) has raised the issue by introducing S. 1851, "a bill to provide that news reporters shall not be required to disclose confidential communications in Federal courts or before committees of Congress."

The key provision of the bill reads: "a person engaged or employed in the work of gathering, compiling, editing, publishing, disseminating, broadcasting, or televising news shall not be required in any court of the United States to disclose the source of information procured by him for such publication, broadcasting, or televising."

Senator Keating said he recognizes this is a controversial subject and stressed that he has no intention of exempting any reporter from the libel and slander laws. He added:

"I do not claim that the bill in its present language is a final answer to this problem, but I am hopeful that it will serve as a vehicle for centering attention on the issue and exploring the possibilities of a fair and reasonable solution."

He noted that 12 states have enacted legislation similar to what he proposes. He placed in the Congressional Record summaries of the statutes in Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Indiana, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, Montana, New Jersey Ohio and Pennsylvania.

The bill has been referred to the Senate Judiciary Committee, of which Keating is a minority member.
