Protect Your Stored Grain From Insects

Controlling grain weevils and beetles after they have infested your grain is a time consuming task:

A few precautions beforehand will prevent trouble later on. We suggest:

1. Feed or otherwise dispose of all remaining old grains
2. Clean bins thoroughly
3. Spray bin walls, floor, and ceiling to the point of runoff with a solution of 1 pint malathion premium grade 57% emulsifiable

liquid to 3 gallons of water. Second choice material for this purpose is DDT. Use 2 pounds 50% DDT wettable powder in 3 gallons water.

4. As an added precaution, grain may be treated as it is stored. Use 1 pint premium grade 57% malathion in 2-5 gallons of water for 1000 bushels. Spray on grain as it enters the bin.
