Erie County Fair Opens Saturday

Big circus, big Startes Midway, big parades, big auto thrill shows, big prizes, big horse show, big flower show, big free exhibits, big tree parking areas, big crowds—all spell the biggest Erie County Fair in history! The 122nd annual exposition opens next Saturday, August 17th, and continues through Saturday August 24th, big Car Racing Day, at the Hamburg Fairgrounds.

All exhibits will be open and complete by Saturday morning. Crammed into the first day activities will be a 4-H Junior Horse Show in the show ring, where a new judging stand and box seats have been installed this year. The Erie County Bait and Fly Casting championship will be decided at the Conservation Pool. Jack Kochman's Helldrivers and their daredevil auto thrill show will appear in both afternoon and evening performances, for the first time on opening day. Circus acts of the Don Ameche International Showtime Circus and a big fireworks display will close the grandstand show at 10:30 p.m.

Highlight of the Sunday grandstand show will be the great War Veteran's parade in the evening, followed by spectacular circus acts. The United States Air Force Drum and Bugle Corps and Bagpipe Band will perform in the afternoon and lead the parade at night.

Don Ameche's complete show, a continental style three-ring presentation of wild animal acts, tumblers and aerialists, will follow the big Children's Parade and Review of School Bands Monday afternoon. At night Jack Kochman's Helldrivers will again defy death in their spectacular stunts for the grandstand audience, and the Don Ameche Circus will conclude the entertainment program.

Harness Racing will open Tuesday afternoon; there will be afternoon and evening performances of the International Circus and at night, a new set of auto daredevils, the Hurricane Helldrivers will perform.

Wednesday will feature the judging of the 4-H Beef Cattle in the paddock and the rooster crowing contest at sundown at the Poultry Building. There will be harness racing again in the afternoon, the famed horsepulling contest, afternoon and evening Circus performances and the Hurricane Helldrivers for another jam-packed day and night of fairgoing.
