## Allegheny County Unit Allocated \$3,497.88 By American Cancer Society

A total of \$3,497.88 has been allocated to the Allegheny County Unit of the American Cancer Society for its educational and service programs for the coming year, it was announced recently by George B. Clarke, Jr., President of the local Unit.  
 The grants were made by the New York State Division of the American Cancer Society after careful study by volunteer lay and medical members of its Executive Committee.  
 This is part of the \$520,610.30 allocated by the Division throughout the 54 upstate counties.  
 American Cancer Society research grants at institutions and hospitals in the 54 upstate counties are made by a volunteer committee of prominent researchers and physicians of the national society.  
 Funds for all grants are raised during the annual Cancer Crusade, conducted by the New York State Division and its County Units during April, National Cancer Month. The Allegheny County Cancer Crusade was very successful in 1963. Quota for the county was \$8500.00 but total proceeds from the drive was \$9350.00, with an additional \$1014.00 in Memorials.

## Cornell Announces Conservation Leadership School

C. W. Hebblethwaite, Allegheny County Agricultural Agent announces the first annual Cornell Conservation Leadership School, a new program of leadership training for men actively involved in conservation program planning at the community level. The school will be held at the Arnot Forest, Ithaca, September 13-15.  
 According to Mr. Hebblethwaite the new program, based on the theme "The Science of Conservation", includes an intensive schedule of field and indoor events presented by specialists in natural resources conservation from the New York State College of Agriculture at Cornell.

## State Liquor Authority Announces Primary Day Rules For Licensees

The New York State Liquor Authority has announced that on Primary Day, September 5, 1963, the sale of liquor, wine and beer for on premises consumption is prohibited throughout the State during the hours when the polls are open—3 p. m. to 10 p. m., in New York City and 12 noon to 9 p. m. elsewhere in the State. A state-wide prohibition also prevails against the sale of liquor and wine for off-premises consumption during these hours.  
 Section 105 (14c) of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law provides that "no premises licensed to sell liquor and/or wine for off-

premises consumption shall be permitted to remain open on any day of a general or primary election during the hours when the polls are open."  
 Section 106 (5c) of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law provides that "no alcoholic beverages shall be sold, offered for sale or given away upon the premises licensed to sell alcoholic beverages at retail for on-premises consumption on any day of a general or primary election during the hours when the polls are open."  
 The sale of beer for off-premises consumption by grocery and drug stores during the hours when the polls are open on primary day is not prohibited in Allegheny County.
