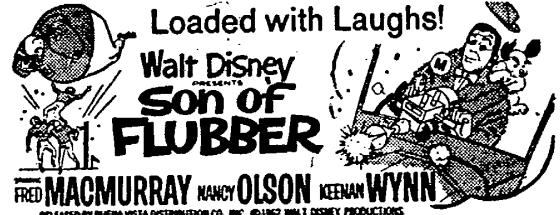
**List Of Delinquent Tax Properties Being Prepared**

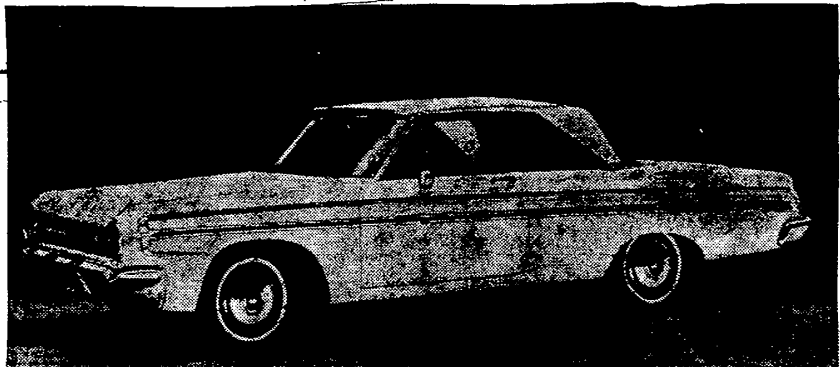
