GREENWOOD NEWS

The Greenwood Town Board held a Special Meeting at the Masonic Hall Monday night about the lighting District. The Board had contacted the Electric Company about more modern lights through town and more lights. The company sent men to demonstrate for the Board. Supervisor Howard Brewster asked for men to come to the hearing but was disappointed Monday when the company sent word the team would not be able to come. About 35 people attended. Supervisor Brewster presided at the meeting, explained the change in lights and the meaning to the taxpayers. The new system would increase the electric cost in the lighting district about \$8.30 to raise the tax \$4.30 a thousand. A vote was taken approving the installation of the new lighting system so the increase could be included in the Budget in October. Supervisor Brewster reported that the Electric Company has two towns ahead of Greenwood and couldn't tell when the new lights would be installed.
