Another successful Andover Central School Fair has gone down in history. Memories have been stirred. Didn't you hear some of the visitor saying to each other, "I remember when." Surely some of the parents of this year's crop of exhibitors were exhibitors when the idea of Andover's School Fair first started. But did you ever wonder how and when the idea of a school fair started?

In 1940 Carl Fribolin, the Agriculture teacher and Ethel Brice, Homemaking teacher, worked together and the School Fair was started. The whole production was held in the gymnasium. One side was reserved for the Homemaking Exhibits with baked goods and fancy work on tables, and sewing on clothes racks.

The other side was an improvised stable with livestock, built up on temporary wooden platforms. Here and there were found the customary chickens, rabbits and puppies in cages. Vegetables, hay and grain were also exhibited. A policy, originated at the first School Fair, which still continues, is giving a prize for the largest pumpkin exhibited.

A short, evening program was followed by a lively auction conducted by the late John Lever. Baked goods, flowers and vegetables were sold to raise the prize money.

School fair spirit has remained strong in Andover for twenty-three years.
