Judge Fitzer Appointed To Supreme Court

Allegany County Judge Norman B. Fitzer has been appointed a justice of the New York State Court.

Judge Fitzer was named to fill a vacancy caused by the death of Judge Philip Halpern. The appointment is for an interim term which continues through 1964. Fitzer becomes the first Supreme Court Justice from Allegany Co., in almost 22 years; the late Bernard Ackerman served in that capacity from 1929 until 1939.
