—Mrs. Bertha Hardy visited her cousin, Mrs. Loie Bloss, in Whitesville last Thursday afternoon.

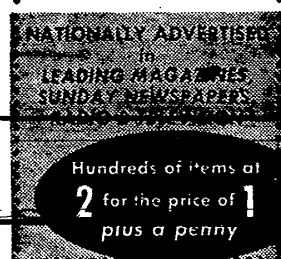

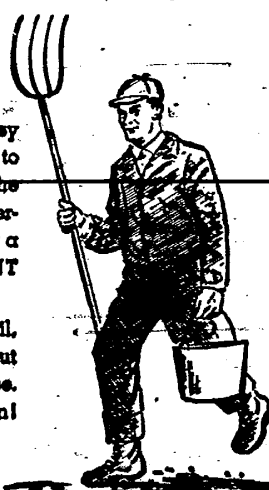
