

**Area Dairy Farmer Shatters Records**

The Holstein-Friesian Association of America reports that two Registered Holstein cows owned by Lewis H. Waters, Whitesville, have shattered all-time New York production records on Dairy Herd Improvement Registry test.

The official 305-day production of Forest Greene Bonheus Jocko 4677046 (GP) totalled 21,680 lbs. of milk and 941 lbs of butterfat to establish a new state butterfat record for Senior four-year-olds milked twice daily. "Jocko" is a daughter of Forest Greene Bonheur Dean 1294414 — a Silver Medal Production Sire.

A paralleling butterfat record for Senior two-year-olds milked twice daily was shattered by Forest Greene Buckstead Mary 5155-336 (GP). Her 305-day record officially totalled 19,220 lbs. of milk and 823 lbs. of butterfat. "Mary" is a daughter of Forest Green Wayne Buckstead 1296336.

Both state champions were bred in the herd of their present owner.

Cornell University supervised the weighing and testing of the new records which were made under the rules of Dairy Herd Improvement Registry — a program for incorporating the D. H. I. A. records of Registered Holstein cows into the framework of official breed improvement programs.
