Specifications For Mountable Spreader Body

Bids will be received at the office of the Town Clerk, Town of Andover, New York up to 8 o'clock (E.S.T.) November 7, 1963, for the purchase of one new gasoline powered Spreader Body for the Highway Department, said bids to be publicly opened and read at a Town Board Meeting held on the above date. The Town Board reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids. Bids shall be submitted in a sealed envelope, marked on the outside thereof, "Bid on Spreader Body." Specifications re as follows:

One gasoline powered, mountable spreader body, nine foot length, 6 cu. yd., heaped capacity, meeting the following minimums:
BODY MATERIAL: welded steel 10 gauge with reinforcing ribs and gussets. Self contained, unit construction.
ENGINE: Air cooled gasoline engine, 4 cycle, at least 24 H.P., with starter and generator, storage battery and auxiliary equipment, engine enclosure.
CLUTCH: Electro-magnetic with Cab Control.
TRANSMISSION: Single Speed.
CONVEYOR: Spiral auger type with agitator. Mechanism shall unload body to a complete clean-out.
BEARINGS: Sealed taper and ball bearings throughout.
SPINNER: Twenty inch diameter with 6 replaceable vanes driven by cut steel gears running in oil bath.
SHROUD: Enclosure for spinner shaft and material drop shall be adjustable for height of truck as well as width of spread.
SPREAD: Capability to spread 30 foot width required.
GRID: Steel grid hinged to cover hopper; shall be designed to screen out lumps of material which cannot be passed by conveyor.
CONTROLS: Electric controls for throttle and clutch, as well as ammeter mounting at truck dash.
MOUNTING: Quick-mounting fasteners and hold-downs for securing body in regulation dump truck body, readily demountable.
DELIVERY: F.O.B. Town of Andover Garage, Andover, N. Y. shall be assured by bidder within not more than thirty (30) days following award of bid.
