**State To Inventory Fall Duck Flights**

Duck hunters take note. At least one of the "birds" flying low over your blind may have a propeller on its nose!

On Monday (Nov. 11), the State Conservation Department began its annual 3,000-mile aerial inventory of waterfowl to determine the size and timing of the 1963 fall migration flights compared with previous years. The two-week statewide survey is being made by a pilot-biologist team using a yellow float - plane — (N-601).

Albert G. Hall, chief of the bureau of game, explained that this year's survey is especially important to determine what effect the recent drought has had on the normal distribution of waterfowl throughout the State. "We know that many marshes lack water", he said, "but we want to see if the birds have

moved out of the state or have concentrated on water-abundant areas."

The low flying waterfowl spot- ters cover all major duck areas in the state including Long Island the Hudson Valley, Lake Champlain, the St. Lawrence and Niagara Rivers, Chautauqua Lake, marshes along Lake Ontario, the Finger Lakes and the Mohawk Valley.

Hall explained that the survey must be made during the open gunning season, but hunters should not be alarmed that the low flying plane will drive the birds away.

"Although sportsmen in the immediate vicinity may be inconvenienced for a few moments", he said, "the usual result is that the stirred up birds drop in on the hunters to afford better shooting."

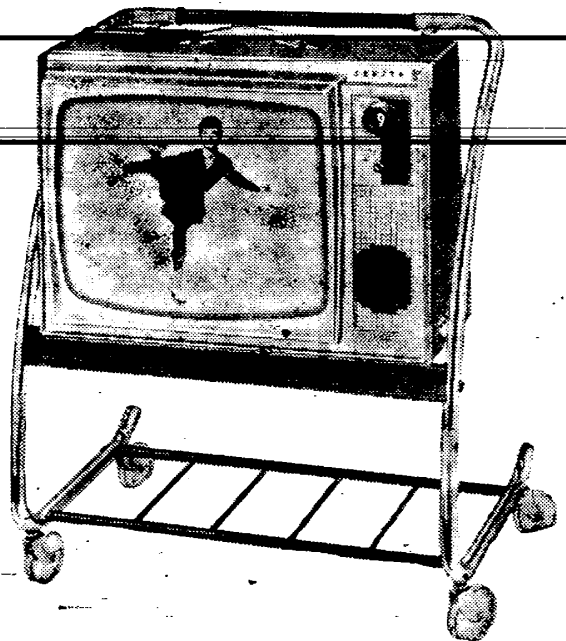
