Hunters Kill 127 Bears During Early Adirondack Season

Northern New York's some-times bothersome bear population was reduced by 127 during the State's first experimental early bear season which ran Oct. 1 - 10

The special ten day bonus was "quite successful" in terms of reducing the nuisance problems caused by hungry bruins searching

Conservation Department said.

A total of 7,369 permits were assued for the special bonus hunt and all but 15 percent of the permit holders took advantage of the warm weather season.

Department game specialists reported that about one bear was killed for avery 50 hunters who went afield. This compares with a success ratio of approximately one for every 300 hunters during a regular big game season.

Hamilton County kept a firm grip on its title of "best bear area in the Adirondacks" with 53 black bears reported killed during the special season. It was followed by Essex with 32, Franklin with 16, St. Lawrence with 14, nine in Clinton and three in Warren.


