**Chicago Stock Show  
First Week Of December**

Farmers and ranchers from near and distant parts of the United States and Canada will be converging on Chicago the first week of December for the 64th International Live Stock Exposition and Horse Show.

It will be held here in the 13-acre International Amphitheatre at the Chicago Stock Yards November 29 to December 7. Owners in over 30 states and Canada have made entries for its competitions that will include 37 breeds of purebred beef and dairy cattle, horses, sheep, and hogs.

The management predicts livestock entries will approach the 10,000 mark. They will be on display for the visiting public during the 9-day run of the exposition.

The International is the finals of the stock show year. State and County Fairs are held in the Summer. They are followed by regional stock shows in the Fall; and the Chicago Exposition is the close and climax of the stock show year.

Nearly every entry has been a high-ranking winner at some previous show or fair; so a blue or purple ribbon win at the International is a recognition stockmen prize above all.

The International Horse Show, daily entertainment feature of the Exposition, is the country's largest showing of saddle and harness and hunters and jumpers.

Star attraction of the 1963 Horse Show will be the Royal Canadian Mounted Police in their renowned Musical Ride, a spectacular precision riding performance by 30 red-coated Mounties on matching black horses. It is their only appearance in the United States this year.


