

Norbert Lynch Attends Bargaining Agency Annual Meeting

Delegates to the Metropolitan Cooperative Milk Producers Bargaining Agency gave strong backing to a dairy bill sponsored by Congressman Samuel Stratton during the Agency's annual meeting last week, Nov. 20 and 21, in Hotel Syracuse.

Delegate Norbert Lynch representing the And-Well Producers Coop., Inc., reported the Stratton bill provides for voting separately on amendments to milk orders without endangering the milk order itself. At present, a "no" vote on an amendment could nullify the entire order.

Mr. Lynch was one of 77 delegates attending the Agency's 27th Annual Meeting.

He reported that Stratton, who spoke at the Thursday luncheon, and Senator Kenneth Keating, banquet speaker on Wednesday night, both discussed agricultural problems.

Keating rapped the "sectional outlook in the policies of the Department of Agriculture and called for the development of a global agricultural policy to improve the economic position of the American farmer." He urged the creation of an independent and bipartisan Study Committee on Agriculture with a view of developing sound national policy.

Stratton called for a mass grassroots outpouring of telegrams and petitions from New York State dairy farmers on the desk of Secretary Freeman urging him to hold off on the issuance of any amended milk order until his bill has had an opportunity to be considered in the House and Senate.

In other business, delegates approved the re-election of District Directors Joseph Gibson, Ellenburg Depot, N. Y.; Frank Garrison, Middletown, N. Y.; and Howard Burdick, Andover, N. Y.

Newly elected was Leonard Michael of Winthrop, N. Y.

Mr. Lynch also reported delegates approved a resolution changing the Agency's stand on production controls. The resolution, citing changed supply-demand conditions, opposed production controls but that if at a later date the Agency's board of directors finds a program is needed, a program should be developed along lines previously approved. Such program would require submission to the House of Delegates for their approval.

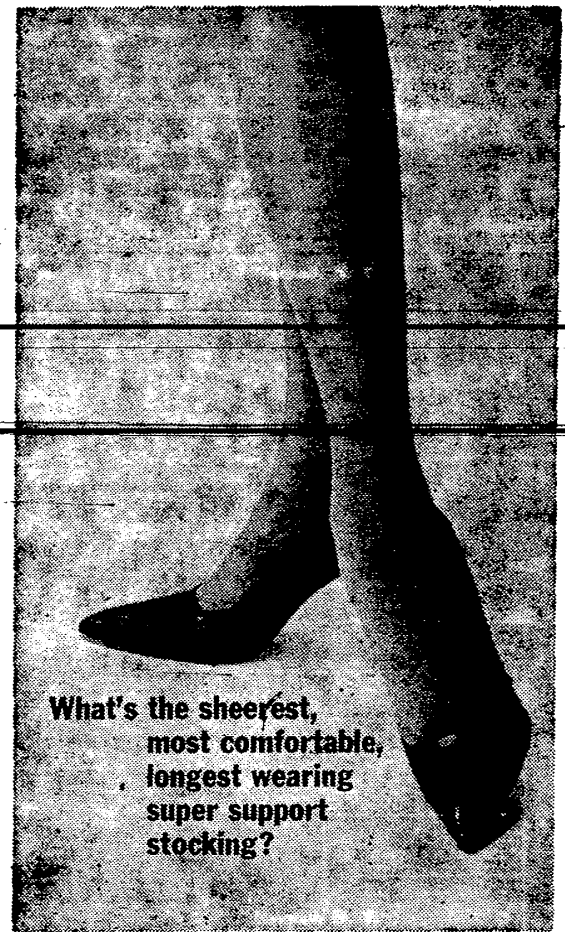
