Certified mail service 20c plus 10c for return receipt provides a record of delivery at the office of address. Valuable mail should be Registered.

Pack, Wrap and Tie with String your packages to be mailed and address plainly on one side. It is advisable to write address on package in case label should become loose.

Please separate your letters for local and out-of-town delivery.

Post Office will be open from 8 A. M. to 6 P. M. beginning Monday, December 9th thru 21st Wednesday and Saturday included.

The injured passengers were taken to the Jones Memorial Hospital by ambulance while Mrs. Bernet was taken to a Bolivar Funeral Home. Funeral arrangements are incomplete.
