People who think TB is licked are using the wrong yardstick, says Christmas Seal Chairman, Frank W. Williams. Measured against the toll early in the century, the gains are truly impressive. But measured against the fact that tuberculosis can be completely wiped out, today's cases and deaths are doubly tragic.

The eradication of TB could be a reality, Mr. Williams reports, if all available weapons against the disease were used in an all-out campaign. These weapons include finding every infected person thru X-rays or tuberculin skin tests, tracking down all close contacts of the TB victim, periodic checkups by those with inactive TB and the systematic use of anti-TB drugs and other medical measures.

"The person who says TB is licked is a danger to all of us," Mr. Williams warns. "He adds to the complacency and apathy that could pave the way for a comeback of TB, and he discourages eradication efforts by health departments and the Health Association."

He stressed that you catch TB as you catch a cold — it is an infectious, not an inherited disease. Thus no one in the community is safe as long as a single infected person spreads TB germs. Amer-

ica has 50,000 new TB cases each year.

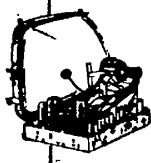
