A spectacular fire which was discovered about noon Thanksgiving Day, destroyed the Masonic Temple on Genesee St., in Hornell, leaving the brick wall shell of the building standing. The cause of the fire has not yet been determined, but is apparently started around the heating boiler beneath the rear of the dining room and had been burning for some time before it was discovered. The building was termed a total loss and only a few possessions of the various Masonic groups which used the building were saved. Some of the records were saved. All of the lodge room furniture was lost and a \$8,000 pipe organ which was in the southwest corner of the lodge room. Uniforms, robes and other paraphernalia of the Masonic groups also were destroyed. The building was 102 years old said Harold Kreason, president of the Masonic Hall Association. The ceiling of the lodge room was covered with gold leaf. The work was done by Tiffany's of New York City in 1905 and 1906, at a cost of \$1,200. The same work today however, probably would run \$10,000.
