Plans Available For ____ Machinery Shed, Shop

Some farm operators might wish Some farm operators might wish to build a machinery shed with adjoining shop, while others may, prefer one with adjoining living quarters. Plans for both are offered by the N. Y. State College of Agriculture, Cornell University.

The first design details a storage section of economical poletype construction. It is erected in 12-foot units, so that it can be built to a size to meet individual needs. Concrete masonry is suggested for the walls of the shop,

The second design provides a means of holding down initial building costs on new farms, according to the Cornell agricultural engineers. The living quarters may be converted to some other use when a permanent house is built

The living section includes two bedrooms, a bath, kitchen, and living room.
