Cuba Central School To Be Host For County Music Festival April 3-4

The Allegany County School Music Teachers' Assn., Monday night picked Cuba Central School as the host for the County Music Festival to be held April 3-4.

The decision was made at the December business meeting that drew 17 music teachers to the music rooms of the Belmont Central School, and was directed by Mrs. Wilda K. Williams of Houghton, President.

Festival chairman will be Kenneth Ingram, instrumental music teacher; and Miss Marian E. Johnson, vocal music instructor, both

of Cuba Central School. Adjudicators will be selected from a state list.

Following the business meeting, instrumental and vocal teachers separated into screening groups which selected students who will play and sing in the 17th annual All-County Band and Chorus concert, to be conducted at 8 p. m., Feb. 15, in the Wellsville Central High School auditorium.

The selections were made from scores on audition sheets recorded in Saturday's auditions at Sci Central School.

Student vocalists totalling 164 auditioned for the Chorus, and from the total 97 were selected for the coming concert.

Mrs. Williams said in the soprano auditions, the singers had to make 23 out of a possible 25 points to qualify for the chorus. She commented the results of Saturday's vocal auditions showed a higher quality of singers taking part than in past sessions.

Sixty-eight student instrumentalists, among those auditioned were selected for the All-County Band portion of the concert.

Rehearsals for the All-County event will be conducted from 7 p. m. to 9 p. m., Jan. 13, Feb. 3, Feb. 10, and in a day-long session Feb. 15, all in Wellsville Central High School auditorium.

The band rehearsals will be conducted by William Yerrick, instrumental music instructor at Belmont Central School; and Alex Molinich, Jr., instrumental music teachers at Canaseraga Central School.

The rehearsals of the chorus will be directed by Mrs. Evangeline F. Young, vocal music teacher at Bolivar Central School; and Mrs. Carol McClure, music teacher at Andover Central School.
