1963 Rainfall Lightest In 17 Years

According to the records of the Soil Conservation Service rainfall in Allegany County was the lightest since 1949.

The yearly average rainfall for 17 years has been 30.91" at Belmont. Among the low years were 1949 — 25.63"; 1954 — 25.93"; 1957 — 26.92".

1962 was not a dry year but early growing season rainfall was light. The truth is that 1962 had above average rainfall of 32.73".

It is apparent that the ground absorbed and stored snow melt in the spring of 1963 resulting in fairly good first cutting hay yields.

Good conservation practices which allow soils to absorb water rather than release it rapidly into our drainage systems aid in obtaining good yields even during dry seasons.
